

Characteristics

The anaesthesia and reanimation service of the accredited Hesperia Hospital is the unit in which professionalism and technology converge to provide care support and assistance to the activities of surgery and intervention and the critical area unit, also providing organisational support to the work of the surgery unit and running the critical area unit.

Critical Area

The critical area has 25 beds divided in the following way:

- 11 intensive care
- 8 semi-intensive
- 6 CICU

The area is normally reserved for patients who have undergone heart and vascular surgery, as well as general surgery. The unit also serves the wards and services of hemodynamics and radiology, admitting patients requiring urgent or emergency respiratory, cardio-circulatory and metabolic support.

The technology, high professional standards and direct access to diagnostic and laboratory services make it possible to carry out complex interventions both on a scheduled basis and in urgent or emergency situations 24 hours a day.

Furthermore, the effectiveness and efficiency of the service is enhanced by the fact that the surgery unit and the hemodynamic room are on the same floor and connected by contiguous and protected corridors.

The critical area is staffed by a team of specialist anaesthesiologists and intensivists who, within the context of an interdisciplinary activity involving professional nurses, cardiologists, surgeons (heart, vascular and general), specialists (nephrologists, pneumologists, etc.), as well as the families, are able to take care of the patient from the standpoint of both diagnosis and treatment.
